Namrata will take a lead on WMRHA's Thriving Colorado Dashboard for Region 12.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Program is supported at State level – there are 21 regional health connectors • WMRHA serves Garfield, Eagle, Pitkin and Summit Counties • Namrata has access to see what other counties are doing. Helps to share knowledge and successes; and also challenges and how to overcome those. • Idea is to sustain this position to continue other projects and work in the future • Board planning to work on affirming and revising the strategic plan in September. 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	<p>Thriving Colorado Data Dashboard</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Received scholarship for \$5K per year for the next two years. • Used by Health Alliances and Public Health doing a scalable data dashboard. • Group can use information in a anyway needed/wanted <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ In August there will be a training and start a build up process – decide what to include and what is the important things to measure and how to use this to do collective impact work. ○ It has been successful in Weld County – they have embraced this format and are willing to assist alliance as needed. This technical assistance is part of the scholarship award. ○ Dashboard gives opportunity to measure key indicators as a region as well as track county specific data. ○ Purpose of the Alliance is to be a convening coordinating body to bring organizations together to address health and the Social Determinants of Health. <p>Accountable Health Communities Model</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It's a 5 year model. • WMRHA will be the lead for the four counties. • Requirements are to serve 100k Medicare/Medicaid recipients for basic needs – (housing, food, medical, etc.) and make referrals. • 100k recipients are from four West Mountain regions not just our four counties. • Our role is to identify gaps and develop plans to address the gaps. • Bring together organizations to work on a system level to coordinate and make sure right partners are at the table. • Ensure services are not being duplicated. • The steering committee is aligning potential initiatives as one of the grant requirements. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It was always Rocky's intention to do this kind of initiative. ○ This started with a lot of ideas and brainstorming and community involvement. ○ Part of the strategy to expand the use of 211 and build it out for our region to connect people to available resources ○ Using technology (QHN) to share data and capture SDoH – (focus on future efforts). • Training in August. 	<p>Contact Cristina if interested to attend August training</p>
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SIM/RHC Projects Review	<p>RHC is an organizational navigator that helps collaborate and link all the organizations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Namrata has reviewed many regional assessments, collected data, completed one-to-one interviews, and prepared a gap assessments from this process. <p>Three priorities have been identified to work with the social determinants of health.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Care Coordination Asset and Gap Mapping – has been very successful <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Figure out who is doing what, availability of resources, training needs and gaps. Thriving Colorado Dashboard <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Help share goals, resources, avoid duplication and achieve collective impact. Zero Suicide Initiative <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Suicide is a top leading cause of death. Increase community awareness – not a tool and not one standard screening. Provider level effort initially <p>Projects may be expanded.</p>	
Advocacy, Policy and Legislative Review	<p>Changes in Healthcare Center for Health Progress Legislative Wrap-up shows a clear picture of health care issues and legislation.</p> <p>Changes and Impacts: There would be approximately \$600K Coloradans that may lose their Medicaid coverage – (including the elderly and disabled population)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Mountain Family Health Center 4,000 current patients would be uninsured. Behavioral health care will become optional with removal of parity. Public Health will see 12% budget reduction for disease surveillance and vaccine prevention. <p>Advocacy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What insurance plans are available for individuals next year? Who will be the providers? Would group want to receive updates from alliance and what is the best way to communicate? – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Want more local information – (how it impacts us locally) 	<p>Cristina will work to localize information and share impacts from local experts.</p>
