Our Commitment:

We are happy to present to the communities in our Tri-County (Eagle, Garfield, and Pitkin) region with this resource guide of organizations serving residents from Aspen to Parachute. This guide was born from needs shared by 392 people who were interviewed during the last three months of 2020 for the Hispanic/Latinx Community Need Assessment Report. This was an in-depth process funded by the Protect Our Neighbor (PON) planning and infrastructure grants from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, received and managed by Pitkin County Public Health, in partnership with the West Mountain Regional Health Alliance. The assessment results gave our team insights into best practices serving the Latinx communities of older adults, men, women, university students, and youth.

The following excerpt is from the PON Report: "The COVID pandemic demonstrated existing system gaps in providing resources in the Latinx community. It was clear we needed to create a comprehensive resource guide with all organizations serving the Latinx community by category of services and a clear description of Latinx clients the organization serves."

One Latinx leader shared,

"It really feels like there is no support for undocumented families when organizations make it so hard to access the resources. We need better systems in place to help families and make them feel welcomed rather than to push them away, not feeling welcomed, as it [is] already so hard to ask for help."

>> 911

The 911 telephone number is used to report crimes and situations where a person's life or property is at imminent risk of harm. Examples of situations that warrant calling 911:

- Theft in process
- Fire
- A fight or assault in full swing
- A medical emergency
- An accident where there are injured people

Dialing 911 is the quickest and easiest way to contact local fire, police and medical services during an emergency. You have to stay CALM. It is easier to share vital information if you are calm and listen to the questions asked. BREATHE DEEPLY.

The questions the 911 operator will ask you are simple:

- What is the address of the emergency?
- What is the phone number he is calling from?
- Tell me exactly what happened.

The more information you can give dispatchers, the better they can serve you. Always be the last to hang up the call. In this way, you will ensure the dispatcher will have all the necessary information about the emergency.

Calling 911 is the most effective way to answer your call. Only in cases where you are in an area where you cannot call 911, you can then text 911 numbers and connect that way. Calling 911 as a prank is a felony.
